Meeting Minutes for February 21, 2002 Committee Meeting

Location: Ammons Pittman Realty, 911 Paverstone Court

Time: 7:00–8:30 PM

Attending: Jay Shapiro, Chair; Jack Forbes; Karen Untz (took minutes); Cheryl Yanello; Robin Lyter; Pam & Woody Burnette; Helen Jones; Bob Anderson; Sam Pickens; Paul Woolverton, Greystone Board president

Agenda Items

- 1) **Geese:** Recommendation to commit funds to have USDA come in to addle the eggs on Greystone Lake. Paul, Helen and Jay will meet by canoe with pros to help locate the nests. The same on the other lakes would be ideal, but not sure who could help ID nests. Pam Burnette helped do research, and will continue to get more info about border collie tactics.
- 2) **Concern regarding erosion into lake near 7100 Valley Drive:** Recommendation to write letter to homeowner requesting erosion control fence.

Post-Meeting follow up: After personal inspection of the area in question by Jay Shapiro, Paul Woolverton and Merle Marxen it was determined that no letter to the homeowner was necessary and the following post-meeting note was received from Jay Shapiro on February 24:

Karen, please modify your meeting notes to reflect the following: The discussion regarding erosion and mud flow from a homeowner's property was later determined to be caused by events unrelated to any homeowner action. The Maintenance Committee, as soon as it is formally appointed by the Board, will initiate any necessary actions to reduce silting of the lake between bridge D and map area 13.

- 3) **Grass reseeding of muddy areas and alder cutting:** Maintenance Committee will refer problem to M&M, the new grounds company, for cutting and planting.
- 4) **Flagging footpath to aid in mowing distances:** Jay, Bob, Robin will set a date to meet and install marker flags.
- 5) **Water plant project update by Bob:** ducks ate all put the pickle weed —probably take a lot more effort and expense to get established.
- 6) **Question of whether mountain bikes are allowed around lake:** Uncertainty regarding guidelines. Helen and Bob will get more info and report back to Jay.
- 7) **Pollution draining into lake near map area 6:** Cheryl reported Charleston stated it appeared to be just “vegetative” breakdown. Cheryl will call Environmental Services and ask them to test it.
- 8) **Bird houses and bulb planting:** By consensus, we agreed it's OK for Bob (and others) to put up bird houses and plant some bulbs along lake edge or woods.

- 9) **Beaver dam spotters:** Very important to e-mail Charleston (with copy to Jay and other officers) AS SOON AS dams are spotted. Robin Lyter will be our Official Dam Spotter for the creek behind her home and report to Charleston regarding current dams. E-mail will allow us to track responsiveness. We will ask Charleston to respond back via email when dam has been destroyed.

Recommendations for the Maintenance Committee and/or Board

- Addle goose eggs: Approve cost of \$20–35 per nest.
- Beaver dams control: Use e-mail time stamps to track reports to and responsiveness of Charleston and M&M
- Erosion immediately east of bridge D: Maintenance Committee to devise and implement a solution.

Important Issues and Upcoming Events:

LakeWatch Committee Walk-Around to be scheduled in March. Jay will advise of date and time. Bring maps to document current areas of concern.
